News from the Committees

Recreational Amenities – The Pool Committee reports that work is being done now to get ready for the 2020 pool season. This includes maintenance, ordering of some replacement furniture, and general sprucing up of the grounds. The pool entries, foyer, kitchen, and bathroom floors were refinished with a new durable, non-slip Rhino floor coating. Work is also being done to install a water fountain to meet the new 2020 GA State Health Dept requirement. If all goes well, the pool will open for the season April 15. Barring any fall weather emergencies, we will stay open through early October to accommodate the Fall school break.

Mark your calendars for our BSHC Annual Pool Party tentatively scheduled for Sunday, May 3 from 1-4pm.

Please remind your household to not operate any wheeled apparatus on the basketball and tennis courts. These special surfaces can't withstand the abrasion of bikes, scooters, skates, skateboards or the like.

Please remember that all recreation amenities including pool, parking lots, playgrounds & athletic areas close at 9:30pm. Fence jumping, loitering, or other illegal activities on our properties, including our parking lots, is not tolerated and trespassers will be prosecuted. Our 24/7 video surveillance system is helping here.

Keep Buckhead South Beautiful

This past Fall saw several amenities updates and beautification projects throughout our neighborhoods.

The playground received new climbing wall handholds and a new slide. All the swings, including chains and hardware were replaced. Two new whirly spin seats were installed and soft playground surface extended to safely accommodate the seats.

The basketball court was pressure washed and line court painted.

Brush was cut down and the ground seeded for grass along the pool curve road for increased visibility. Trees and brush around the ballcourts were also thinned out.

The downed tree was removed from the Dalcross pond.

The Hampton sidewalk was repaired and the entrance landscaping was cleared of overgrown trees and soon to be replaced with flowering shrubs and mulch.

If your spring cleanup involves outdoor burning, you must obtain a GA DNR Open Burning permit first. Call 877-OK2BURN or DNR online: gatrees.org. Approval is for that day only and is immediate. This permit allows outdoor burning for yard debris only, not household trash or construction debris. "It is unlawful in GA to burn man-made materials such as tires, shingles, plastics, lumber or household garbage, even in a burn barrel." You must be present to monitor and have a water source such a hose or buckets of water within reach. Newer rules state that fire pits and chimineas are no longer exempt, except for recreational purposes and cooking using split firewood or charcoal, not debris. If the fire dept is called out by passer-by concerns and

you don't have this permit, you are subject to a \$125 fine the first instance, and \$550 for repeaters. As always, please be considerate of your neighbors – keep smoke to a minimum by letting yard debris dry out in a staged area first so as to not burn green or wet, schedule your burns infrequently and during less active times, and try to do this only when weather conditions won't keep the smoke curtain stalled. Remember that on beautiful days, noxious smoke can impact neighbors' patio/porch use, open windows and even their HVAC.

As a reminder to all our residents, parking your vehicles in the street as a matter of practice, or as a normal parking spot, is not permitted per our covenants. If for any reason you must park in the street occasionally, for safety sake, please park with the traffic flow rather than against it. Boat parking in driveways, streets or lawns is another frequent source of complaints. BSHC covenants state that boats may be parked in driveways over the weekend or during the week only WHILE IN USE. Street or lawn parking of boats is never allowed, and boats must be stored on your property behind your 6' privacy fence. If you don't have this kind of fence, you must use one of the many off-site local storage companies. In addition to street safety issues, parking cars on our streets or parking boats within front view affects our Street View. Managing this is an on-going project to keep our homes looking stellar and protect your property investment.

Spring is often a time many of us begin home improvement projects, please remember that many exterior home improvements such as additions of fences or outbuildings **must** first be approved by the Architectural Review Committee (ARC). A new ARC Guidelines booklet was distributed to each home in April 2018 and all new residents now receive this booklet in their Welcome Packets. Safety & Security at Home

Access is prohibited to both our neighborhoods' wild vegetative buffers (woods) for safety concerns and private homeowner's property without their permission. We've had reports that some young people are not following this. Being on private property can be considered trespassing and law enforcement can be brought into the situation. As a public service announcement to the community, we ask that you speak with your children about this. The last thing we want in this community is for the Sheriff to be involved in matters that can be resolved with a simple adjustment in behavior.

Did you know that our BSHC roads are Bryan County roads and therefore all operators of motorized carts here must be 16 years old? Yes, you must have a

driver's license to operate golf carts anywhere in Bryan County, including our neighborhood roads. If a cart, scooter, moped, or dirt bike is involved in an accident, regardless of responsibility, the owner of the cart is completely liable for all damage and injuries if an underage person was operating it. We've all seen some of those overloaded golf carts careening through our neighborhoods and the Bryan County Sheriff's Dept has been welcomed to do more frequent drive throughs. If a child is injured or property is damaged, the owner of the golf cart is on the hook for this, and it can be tragic and costly.
