## *News from the Committees*

**Recreational Amenities** – Exceptional effort went into readying our pool for this season given the COVID-19 pandemic. With great anticipation, our pool was opened on Saturday, May 23<sup>rd</sup> to residents in good standing and

whom completed the required COVID-19 Pool Form by the deadline. We hope everyone is enjoying the result. Because this is a shared amenity, it is more important than ever to leave it in the same condition you found it, especially with regards to sanitation procedures, keeping chairs and loungers in their socially distanced places, bussing out your trash to the entryway containers, and taking all personal items home. Please also be aware the pool is only open **7am to 9:30pm** and there's a clock there to help you leave on time.

Regrettably, due to COVID-19, we are unable to open up use of, or reservations for, the pool kitchen for the time being. When this changes, we will let you know.

The Annual Pool Party has been postponed to August 2nd from 1-5pm and will offer the popular 2 sizes of water slides, food, snow cones and great fun for all. Bring your chairs if you plan to hang out outside the pool area where the food and water slides will be, or you can lounge by the pool. Stay tuned for details on how this year's event may likely differ to accommodate social distancing practices. Also, as in previous years, the Pool Committee asks for volunteers to help with set up, clean up, and supervising the water slides. Please consider lending a few extra moments of your time to help make this event enjoyable for all.

Unfortunately, the basketball court has been closed since the middle part of April due to one of the backboard posts being broken. It was not vandalism, but rather strong play. However, the post and concrete should have been able to handle it, so the repair will strengthen the area to prevent reoccurrence. The fix is fairly complex, involving concrete work and reattaching the backboard post to the concrete pad. We have hired a contractor but there is a backlog of work in the area and they are not able to start work until late May. Further, the new concrete will need to set for 28 days minimum. Thus, we are estimating the courts being closed into the beginning of July 2020. We apologize for the inconvenience this causes. We want to ensure this repair is permanent for our residents' safety and future enjoyment.

Please remind your household not to operate any wheeled apparatus on the basketball and tennis courts. These special surfaces can't withstand the abrasion of bikes, scooters, skates, skateboards or the like. Also, please use only as intended (no soccer or other sports on the tennis or basketball courts).

## Pool FAQs:

*How do I get the gate code?*

If your dues are paid in full and you've filled out the required COVID-19 Pool Form, you will receive the monthly pool gate code via the email address BSHC has on file for your household.

*Why haven't I received the gate code email?*

If you meet the above requirements and feel you've been missed, try the following:

- 1) check your email spam folder – some software classifies mass emails as spam if sender is not in your contact list;
- 2) make sure no one else in your household is deleting BSHC emails before you have read them;
- 3) contact [buckheadsouthhoa@gmail.com](mailto:buckheadsouthhoa@gmail.com) to be sure your correct email is on file (and add BSHC to your contacts).

*Please remember that all recreation amenities including pool, parking lots, playgrounds & athletic areas close at 9:30pm. Fence jumping, loitering, or other illegal activities on our properties including our parking lots, is not tolerated and trespassers will be prosecuted. Our 24/7 video surveillance system is helping here.*



## June 2020 Treasurer's Report:

The **Treasurer** reports that we are wrapping up the 2020 dues collection. The dues deadline was March 31<sup>st</sup> with a 30-day grace period until the Late Penalty and all further actions would begin. We are 97% collected at this time. We thank all members that paid their dues on time and without time-consuming prompting, especially during this difficult start to the year.

Our dues are the only source of income for BSHC and must cover our bills for the entire year. Our Annual Dues rate of \$550/yr. has not increased since 2005, an admirable effort given that we have experienced rate increases from all our vendors, from grounds, to pool, to insurance etc. Our dues have remained much lower than nearby HOA's, accomplished by careful spending and volunteer Board members' efforts. Because all building lots in our neighborhoods are sold, we no longer have future houses to fuel our dues growth, and must make our current income stretch to cover expected expenses.

**Where do our dues go?** The pie chart below shows that 30% goes for **groundskeeping** (mowing, mulch, ponds, tree work); 22% for **utilities** (electricity for pool, streetlights, entrance lights, pool phone/WIFI); 21% for **pool** (maintenance, chemicals, repairs, night cleaning); 9% to **stabilization** emergency fund (for emergency repairs etc.); 8% for **maintenance** and general property repairs (structures, playground, etc.); 6% for **insurance** (property, liability, directors) 2% for **water** (pool & common areas irrigation) 1% for **social/meetings** (annual pool party, welcome committee materials, annual meeting); and 1% for **administration** (supplies, printing, postage, permits). You can see what a good bargain our members receive by your neighbor-volunteers doing all the administrative work free of charge. If we hired a management company to collect dues, handle architectural design approvals, maintain covenant enforcement, pay bills, and do all member communications, our dues would easily be 35-55% higher.



## Keep Buckhead South Beautiful

As the beautiful spring weather we've been enjoying gives way to the familiar Georgia heat of our summer season, the window to wake up those lawns, if you haven't already, is nearly over. For watering, our irrigation systems work best for our lawns when you set it to operate between 1-5AM for once cycle of 10-15 minutes per zone, 2-3 times/wk; or half that run time when doing a two-cycle rotation each time. Watering too late in the morning or into the afternoon causes water waste through evaporation from our intense Georgia sun. Conversely, watering too early in the night can contribute to fungus growth in our lawns. It is also vital to maintain the grass height. Mowing grass too short weakens it and letting it get too long can contribute to fungus growth due to excess moisture accumulation. The key to a healthy lawn is watering deeply and infrequently in the very early morning and maintaining proper grass height.

We noticed many seemed to get into a home improvement mindset during the recent 'shelter-in-place' mandate. It's always nice to see residents taking such care and pride in their homes and our neighborhood. As you make your plans, please recall that most exterior home improvements such as additions of fences or outbuildings, or significant changes to street view **must** be approved by the Architectural Review Committee (ARC) first. Go to our website [www.buckheadsouth.com](http://www.buckheadsouth.com) under the "documents" tab to see the Architectural Review Guidelines and download the ARC application form. Questions? ## Safety & Security at Home

Although our neighborhoods generate very little crime, we are not immune to it. Vehicles in your driveway should be locked, especially if you have electronics or other loose items in full view. And if your unlocked car has a garage door remote, you have now provided access to your house. "Lock it to block it" is the best policy. If you see possibly suspicious activity, note all details you can and call the Bryan County Sheriff's office **immediately**. Their non-emergency number is (912) 653-3800 and, as always, dial 911 for emergencies.

In these strange times of COVID-19, it cannot go without mentioning the new meaning of keeping our families, neighborhoods, and greater community safe. With the shelter-in-place orders recently lifted and various business and public spaces gradually opening up, the adjacent graphic issued by Bryan County Recreation may help clear up any confusion on what current orders and procedures are in place pertaining to visiting our area parks and public spaces. Please take a moment to familiarize yourself with the expectations for Phase I of the reopening.

## REOPENING PARKS & RECREATION PHASE I

### EXECUTIVE ORDERS

- All employees are required to wear masks at all times.
- Employers must screen and evaluate workers who exhibit signs of illness, such as a fever over 100.4 degrees and a cough or shortness of breath.
- Party size is limited to no more than 6 per field or closed/fenced in area.
- Access to indoor facilities is currently not allowed.
- Encourages visitors to bring their own EQUIPMENT.

Encourages recreation to move to a reservation-only for facility usage.

### GUIDELINES

TO ENSURE SOCIAL DISTANCING AND MAINTAIN 6 FEET OF SPACE BETWEEN INDIVIDUALS, OUR FACILITIES WILL REOPEN FROM THE HOURS OF 9 A.M. - 4 P.M. DURING WEEKDAYS, AND

#### VISITORS CAN SIGN UP VIA PHONE THE DAY BEFORE FOR 1-HOUR RESERVATIONS AT THESE AREAS.

- Baseball Fields (5 people at a time)
  - Batting Cages (2 people inside cage at a time)
  - Tennis Courts (2 people per court, no doubles)
  - Skate Park (5 skaters at a time)
  - Outside Basketball Courts (1 person per goal)
  - Grass Soccer Fields (1 person per goal)
  - Turf Fields (8 people per field, spread out with goals)
  - Football Fields (2 people on opposite halves of field for individual training)
  - Pickleball (2 people per court, no doubles)
  - Bark Park (6 feet of space between you/your dogs and other visitors)
  - Pavilions (4 people at a time)
  - Refrain from large gatherings in any area
  - Walking Trails are open without sign-up
  - Playgrounds will remain closed
- Other areas will remain closed to maintain 10-person capacity per location
